1. **Aim**

The aim of Orley Farm School Uniform Policy is to provide a smart uniform that promotes equality and encompasses the ethos of the School to help promote a good working environment.

2. **Objectives**

At Orley Farm School, the objective of wearing the School Uniform is to:

- Engender a sense of pride in the School
- Promote a sense of community and belonging towards the School
- Allow the child to be identified with, and as part, of the School
- Allow the child to feel equal in terms of their appearance relative to their peers
- Be practical and smart
- Be suitable wear for School
- Be designed with Health and Safety in mind
- Prevent wearing of fashionable clothes that may be unsuitable for the School day.

3. **Jewellery**

Decorative jewellery of any sort is not permitted. Earrings are not allowed to be worn in school in any circumstances.

Any [request](#) to wear jewellery for religious reasons must be agreed in advance with the Deputy Head Pastoral via the form on the link.

Named watches (without Wi-Fi connection) may only be worn by children in Year 5 and above.

4. **Hair**

Hair should be clean, well-kept and be its natural colour. It should be styled in a way that keeps it off the face and does not cause distraction or interfere with learning. Long hair (at or below shoulder length) must be tied back for health and safety reasons. While we value individuality, extreme or unconventional hairstyles that draw undue attention or disrupt the school environment are not permitted.

5. **Make Up**

Pupils are not permitted to wear make-up. We do not permit nail varnish or temporary tattoos.

6. **Additional requests**

Any [request](#) to deviate from the stated uniform policy for religious, transgender or other reasons needs to be agreed in advance with the Deputy Head Pastoral via the form on the link.

Please ensure that ALL garments brought or worn to school are properly marked with name-tapes. Footwear should also be clearly marked. Games Kit must also have your child's initials sewn on to the upper left side of garments. Towels must also be clearly marked.

Blazer must be worn to and from school and in all assemblies and formal occasions.

In Middle and Upper School on days when pupils have games lessons, they should attend school in their Games Kit and Blazer.

In Middle and Upper School on days when they have PE (including swimming), they will wear their full school uniform and change into their PE kit at school.

In Pre-Prep on days when they have PE, Meadow School or swimming (Summer Term) they should attend school in their PE kit and/or tracksuit and blazer.

Pupils may travel home in Games kit, when Games is at the end of the school day, at the discretion of the Games teacher.

Black base layers (e.g. skins) may be worn under tracksuits during academic lessons, provided they are not visible. They may be worn visibly during games and PE lessons only.
